***CALL TO WORSHIP**

Prayer of Confession

-Based on Psalm 51.

L: Have mercy on us, O God, according to your steadfast love.

P: Against you alone, we have sinned and done what is evil in your sight.

L: According to your abundant mercy, blot out our transgressions.

P: Knowing you desire truth in the inward being, we name now our transgressions before you with broken and contrite hearts....

Period of silence

- L: Wash us thoroughly from our iniquity, and cleanse us from our sin.
- P: Create in each of us a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within us.
- L: Do not cast us away from your presence or take your holy spirit from us.
- P: Then the joy of your salvation will be restored and we shall be sustained.
- L: Blow the trumpet in Zion! God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

All: Blow the trumpet in Zion! We are forgiven and freed to live anew in Jesus Christ! Amen.

Invitation to Communion

One: We celebrate this holy meal because Jesus' ministry happened around tables: tables where the unwelcome were invited in, tables where even the marginalized were heard; where the powerful were taught and humbled, tables where the hungry were fed and the thirsty were given something to drink. In these meals God's saving presence was revealed and made real, and a new form of community was given birth.

All: We come to this table to meet Jesus, made known in the breaking of the bread.
